SESSION PROGRESS NOTE

S:	This session was provided via telehealth using Zoom due to the current COVID-19 pandemic and temporary closure of Boston Children's Health Physicians Speech & Language Clinic. SZ logged into the session on time and was attentive during all activities.
O:	SZ provided the past tense form of irregular verbs given 4 visual choices 70% of the time, increasing to 100% given intermediate verbal cues. Given a social situation, SZ identified expected and unexpected social behaviors independently 100% of the time. SZ explained why the behavior was expected or unexpected with 100% accuracy given consistent verbal semantic cues. When presented with a visual scenario, SZ identified an individual's emotion independently with 100% accuracy and explained why with 90% accuracy. SZ answered why questions given a sentence starting model with 60% accuracy independently, increasing to 100% accuracy with consistent verbal semantic cues.
A:	SZ appeared to be enthusiastic and willingly participated in all activities. When explaining why a social behavior was expected or unexpected, SZ benefited from a follow-up question. SZ benefited more from shorter questions and answers compared to longer ones. SZ maintained the same skill level with irregular past tense in comparison to prior sessions and continues to benefit from verbal cues. SZ showed marked improvement in expected/unexpected behaviors and emotions. It is important to note that this may be in part due to using an activity he has already done in the past. Overall, SZ benefited from frequent verbal cues.
P:	Continue therapy as planned. Speech therapy sessions will focus on past tense verbs and social pragmatic skills.
